

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# **Rewards and Behaviour Policy**

At The Quran Hub we expect our students to behave as exemplary role models and ambassadors for their communities. Emphasizing how our beloved Prophet (SAW) taught his companions to live their daily lives. Many a times we witness that a child is not praised enough for their dedication and hard work, hence at The Quran Hub, we find it is imperative that a child is shown appreciation and recognition for their hard work.

Students will be rewarded on a daily basis based on their time and effort online and at h ome. A dedicated merit system on class dojo has been introduced to motivate the students.

### How does it work?

A student can attain a merit for various reasons whilst reading in front of their teacher: The merits are logged on by the teacher, upon which the parent can view online.



**Behaviour** - Displaying exceptional character to the teacher.



Classwork - Passing their class work.



**Effort** - Student showing consistency in effort.



Hardworking - If the teacher acknowledges the students hard work, despite finding it a challenge.



Homework - Producing outstanding homework.

At the end of each academic year, students will be rewarded with a certificate according to their performance during the year.



If your child collects 30 merits in a year - he/she will receive a Bronze certificate.



If your child collects 60 merits in a year - he/she will receive a Silver certificate.



If your child collects 90 merits in a year - he/she will receive a Gold certificate.

The certificates will be handed out at the end of the academic year. Students will also be rewarded with a certificate for the following:

- Best attendance
- Most hardworking
- Best punctuality
- Most improved
- Student of the year

# **Behaviour Policy**

At The Quran Hub we withstand a zero-tolerance policy when it comes to misconduct of staff. We expect all our students to behave in a manner that upholds their Islamic ethics and morals at all times. We expect our students to follow the same guidelines of behaviour that they would adhere to at any Madrasah on site.

At The Quran Hub we have a three stage policy for behaviour.

# > Stage 1:

After 3 verbal warnings, a word from the tutor about rectification and self-reflection. At this point your child has been warned about their actions, this will be recorded on our system.

## > Stage 2:

If poor behaviour is displayed consistently, then this will result in stage 2. Parental meeting with the teacher, over the phone. A possible suspension, if the behaviour is affecting progression.

### > Stage 3:

Meeting with the Head teacher to discuss possible outcomes and changes for positive learning. Two weeks monitored by the Head teacher, if the behaviour has regressed from this point, then we move to the final stage.

**Expulsion** - this stage is mandatory, if the child struggles to change or rectify their behaviour.

### **Mobile Phone Policy**

We at The Quran Hub, would like to clarify the usage of mobile phones as this is used as an essential day to day tool. The usage of mobile phones will be restricted online, as they are in any reputable institution on-site. We expect our learners to respect this policy and adhere, as they would at schools/ colleges and other educational institutions. Please note: if a child is seen using a mobile phone during their live lesson, staff will need to inform the head teacher straight away, a possible warning of expulsion could be handed out if persistent usage of mobile phone affects the adab and etiquettes of learning.
